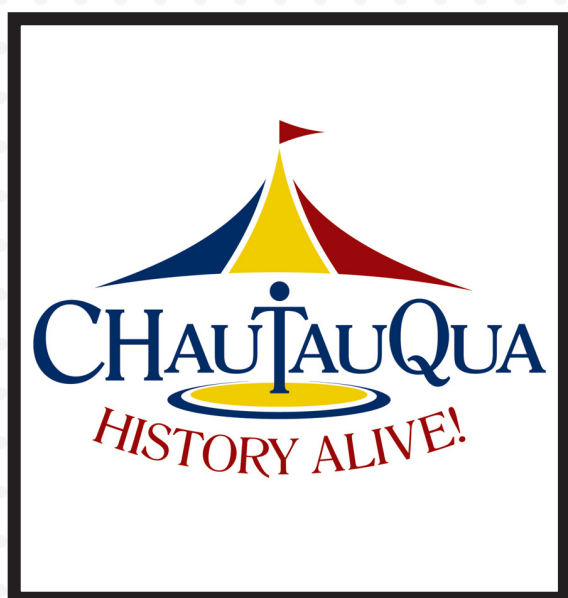
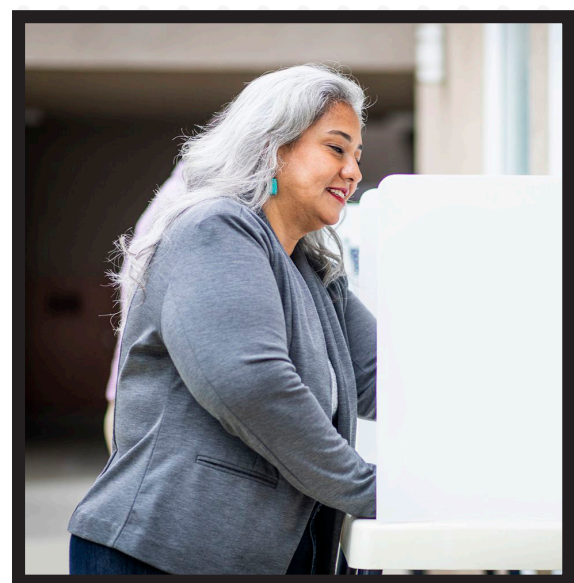


Genealogy Basics - August 10 @ 7pm

Chautauqua: Carrie Chapman Catt - August 25 @ 7pm

Before Carrie Chapman Catt, an Iowa school teacher, principal and superintendent of schools, was 30 years old, she began the work for which she is most lauded: a leader for woman suffrage. But Catt's life must also be defined by her advocacy for international peace. She possessed astonishing skills of organization, diplomacy, strategy and oratory, and she brought all of these gifts to her work for woman suffrage, which began when she joined the fight for the vote through the Iowa Woman Suffrage Association. In little over 10 years, Susan B. Anthony, president of the National American Woman Suffrage Association and "Mother of the Cause," recognized how Catt's talents and leadership ability would bring enormous
